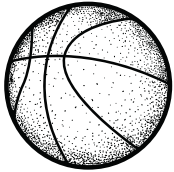

Miss Mitchell: I love Roberts. I don't wish to leave.

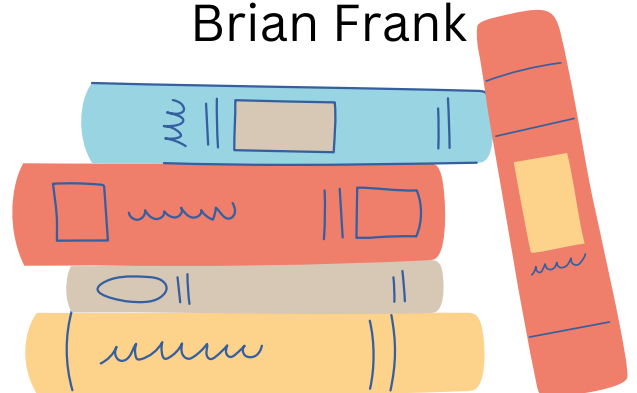
Roberts BPA

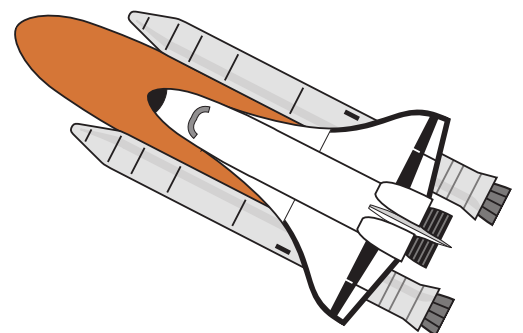
NASA!

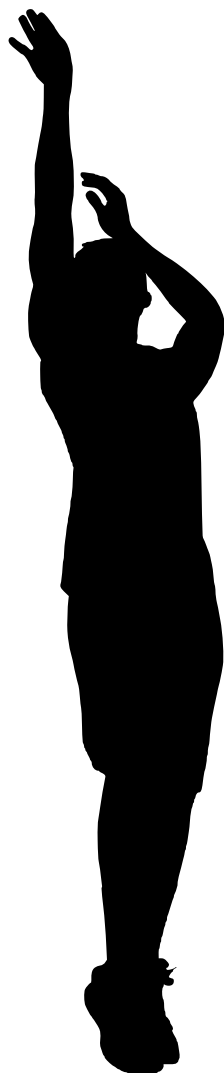
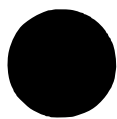
