## Roberts Rockets December- January 2019-2020

#### **Student Happenings**

This fall was one of the more successful fall sports seasons in recent memory at Roberts. First of all, our football co-operative with Red Lodge and Belfry made it all the way to the state semi-finals in football. The last time football played this deep in the season was Fall 2006 when the Rockets lost the state title to Highwood. This was at the end of a four year run of playing in the semi-finals or better in six-man football. This year's team was led by coach John Fitzgerald and a core of seniors. Roberts senior Presten Ehrlich was a very strong offensive and defensive lineman for the Rams and received all-state honors.

Our volleyball program also went to new heights this fall as the high school team went to divisionals for only the third time in program history. For the first time at the southern "C" division, our girls took third place and ended one win away from their first trip to the state tournament. This group of girls lead by coach Melissa Bertolino had no seniors, so the entire group will be back to compete next fall. The group had two all-state players in Emma DeVries and Kimberly Bear.

Our cross country program was younger this year with only one freshman and one sophomore competing at the varsity level. But this group, led by Tina Albers, competed very well against older competition and looks to get back into the top tier of competition next fall with everyone being a year older, stronger and faster next fall.

Our academic programs have also been off and running this fall. Business Professionals of America is busy fundraising and preparing for regional competition on December 10th in Livingston and FFA has already started competition with MSU Ag-Days in Bozeman, but starts their run of District competitions after the first of the year.

From an academic standpoint, I also want to note, of our 15 athletes participating in the fall, 11 received academic-all-state honors.

### **Friday Programs**

Our Friday programs continue to be a huge hit as over 80% of our elementary took advantage of our September, October, and November days. In January we start our run of ski days with field trips to the Red Lodge Mountain planned on January 10th, 14th and February 28th.

#### **Updates to Curriculum**

With grant funds, the district was able to purchase and implement new text series in English Language Arts for grades K-12. The research-based curriculum invested in were <u>Core Knowledge Language Arts</u> in K-5 and <u>Study Sync</u> in grades 6-12. Both curriculums are filled with social studies and science content and have been incredibly engaging to both staff and students. I am excited to see what this implementation does to our overall student learning in the coming years. ## Literacy Grant News.....

The month of November in the first school semester is like every Wednesday in the middle of a work week: they are both hills that can feel like quite an effort to climb. After we conquer them, however, the rest of the time feels like smooth sailing.

This November is certainly living up to that description. At this point in the year, we have checked off the major fall milestones: MAP testing, parent/teacher conferences, report cards, and - just this week - progress monitoring with DIBELS and SBAC Interims.

It has not all been assessment, data and reporting, though. Most elementary classes are well into their 3rd or 4th units in all subjects. The content in Core Knowledge Language Arts is so engaging that I find myself lingering in classrooms just so I can learn, too. Ask a second grader about Greek Mythology or seek out a 4th or 5th grader to learn about the Middle Ages. Kindergarten is exploring classic stories and fiction from other cultures. 1st grade is exploring similar stories from different lands, and the 3rd grade body system posters are a must-see!

The excitement of a new school year hasn't faded in the least. Along with engaging content, staff are also embracing Universal Design for Learning (UDL).

UDL is an approach to teaching aimed at meeting the needs of every student in a classroom. It can be helpful for all kids, including kids with learning and attention issues. But UDL takes careful planning by teachers. Here are just a few examples of how UDL can work in a classroom:

- Posted lesson goals
- Assignment options
- Flexible work spaces
- Regular feedback
- Digital and audio text

Along with UDL, staff are also following the principles of Structured Literacy Instruction, which prepares students to decode words in an explicit and systematic manner. There is substantial

evidence that this approach is effective for *all* readers, not just those with dyslexia or other reading difficulties. These are the six elements of Structured Literacy:

- Phonology
- Sound-Symbol Association
- Syllable Instruction
- Morphology
- Syntax
- Semantics
