As we look to start the 2019-2020 school year, I am excited again to notice the physical changes in the school over the last 3 years. We have updated and renovated 7 of the 8 classrooms in the original building. The science room was updated prior to the most recent renovations. This facelift to the 102 year old portion of the building has improved lighting, energy efficiency, and just made for a more comfortable place for our students to learn. The work has mainly been done by Peter Wisniewski, our facilities director, and supported by Erin Koch. The list of volunteers and contractors who have helped is too long to list but we greatly appreciate all you have done to make this a more comfortable place to learn.

Just as the building is physically changing, our staff is once again seeing some transition. It is always bittersweet to see new staff in the community. When staff leave, many are greatly loved and appreciated by students, parents and other staff, but it is also exciting to see new people, with new ideas, and hopefully another group of people that will make a positive influence in those same students, parents and staff lives. We are welcoming six new teachers this fall. Shannyn Wilson in first grade, Caitlin Hall in grades 4-6 English Language Arts, Jessica Parpart in grades 4-6 Mathematics, Jesse Hall in 7-12 Social Studies, Anna Prinkki 7-12 English, and Tina Albers in K-12 Physical Education. These new teachers bring in various experiences throughout their careers and lives and we are very excited to have them join our community of learning.

As we look at the walls and see years upon years of graduating classes, and as I get to know more people around the community, I am always drawn to the quote of "The more things change the more they stay the same". The first graduating class we have a picture of on our walls is from 1923 and has Ruth DeVries in it. Last spring, in 2019, we again had a DeVries graduate in Ryan DeVries. These similarities in family names are echoed up and down the walls and if I made a complete list the newsletter would be too long to mail. But I bring this family up as one example of the numerous generational families who have supported and walked the halls of this school and this community for over 100 years. I am excited, as we continue to steward generational families throughout the school as students, staff members and even school board members. But as we all know the educational times are severely different than 1923. We strive to educate all students, in all areas, not just a select group in general skills. We offer online classes, dual credit classes for colleges, mental health programs, testing and evaluations, while focusing on continuous school improvement to make sure we stay ahead of the ever changing student and community needs. But what is still at the heart of it all is the need for every student to feel safe, and cared about so they are willing to learn. We are proud to say this focus is just as prevalent today as when the school opened as a place for students to come and learn together in 1917.

Like I have said numerous times before, I am humbled and honored for the opportunity to serve this great school and community. As I enter year six, I get to see students who were not even in junior high when I came, graduate in the spring. It is one of my favorite things to watch these young men and women develop and grow through personal triumphs and tribulations into adults. Some step out ready to grab the world by the horns, while others take a little more time to find their path. But our goal is for all of them to leave here knowing they are cared about and always have a home in Roberts.


